

## **COUNTRY PROFILE**

- Republic of Indonesia
- Capital: Jakarta
- Population 280 million (4<sup>th</sup> in the world)
- Area 1.9 million sq km (14<sup>th</sup> in the world)
- Major religion Islam (1<sup>st</sup> in the world)
- Major languages Indonesian, 300 regional languages
- The economy of Indonesia is the world's 16th largest by nominal GDP
- The median age in Indonesia is 29.7 years, 56.4 % of the population is urban (154 million people in 2020)



# **#1 The Earliest Stage (1960s-1980s)**



- August 17, 1945: Indonesia's Independence Day
- 1960 The first Faculty of Psychology established
- 1964 The first Guidance & Counseling Faculty in Indonesia established
- 1975 New curriculum launched with provide the legality of guidance and counselling in school
- 1975 Indonesian Guidance Officer Bond (Ikatan Petugas Bimbingan Indonesia-IPBI) established
- Career Guidance was managed only in a few school especially for Senior High School students (10% national coverage)

# #2 At the middle stage (1980s-2000s)



- 1984 New Curriculum applied with a focus on providing career counseling service for high school students
- 1990s Misconception about career counseling with resulted in untrained, undertrained, dan uncomitted career counselors: "The School Police"
- 1990s The application of Industrial dan Organizational Psychology in Human Resources field
- At the middle stage, the emphasis was primarily on educational systems and some application in the organizational.

# #3 At the progress stage (2000s-2020s)



- 2001 Indonesian Association of Guidance and Counseling (Asosiasi Bimbingan dan Konseling Indonesia/ ABKIN) established
- 2003 National Education System Law launched, junior high school counsellor legalized
- 2016 Indonesia Career Center Network (ICCN) established in with 150 University Career Centers members joined
- The Booming of the Faculty of Psychology (140+) and Vocational and Educational Guidance faculty in Indonesia (80+)

# **#4 The Present (2020)**



- 2020 55.000 guidance and counseling teachers in school for almost 45 million school age students (Ratio of 1:810)
- Only 250 (10%) of Universities have their own Career Center, some Centers without qualified Career Counselors.
- Old and outdated resources to help students to make good career decisions.
- No official career counselor association nor a published career counseling journal.
- A gap to serve other age-groups: the workers, professionals, people with disabilities, veterans, retirees and the general community
